### OGHRG President's Message - Hot Time, Summer in the City

First, an update from my article last month on graffiti and taggers in OGH. I am happy to report that Devonshire Division Patrol has caught two teams of taggers in the last month. The first team was snagged over Memorial Day weekend as they were tagging the strip mall on the Northwest corner of Chatsworth and Encino. The second team was nabbed a couple of weeks later while tagging a building on the Northwest corner of Chatsworth and Lindley. Both of the arrests were late at night. These arrests are the result of increased concern expressed by the community and solid police work by LAPD. Keep your eyes open, and have the numbers for West Valley Alliance and Devonshire dispatch programmed into your cell phone.

At our last meeting, I appointed an Ad Hoc Committee to address the issue of "Sober Living Homes" in OGH, and in particular the home at 17533 Horace Street. The committee held its first meeting on June 16, 2008. One of my concerns has been that a number of neighbors have been working on this problem from different angles, but there has been no coordination of effort. We remedied that, and received excellent input from the committee members and our Senior Lead Officer, who was also in attendance.

Individual committee members have done a great job gathering information and investigating the issue, and in particular, this facility. We know that this is an unlicensed facility, housing as many as twelve individuals. We know who owns the home, and that they are out of area landlords. And we have an action plan. Our next meeting will include neighbors on Horace and Ludlow streets who are affected by this facility. At that meeting we will have resources from LAPD and discuss the next steps we can take to eliminate this facility from our neighborhood.

Finally, please put Saturday, August 2<sup>nd</sup> on you calendar. That's the date for our 6<sup>th</sup> annual yard party. We are looking forward to hosting the party this year. As usual, this will be a potluck event, with each resident bringing their favorite dish. OGHRG will furnish the meat, beverages, and dinnerware. Please give us a call at 818-831-2318 or email to davebeauvais@verizon.net and let us know what you intend to bring (so we don't end up with too many deserts and not enough salads). ### July Guest Speaker- Ali Ziai; Neighborhood Prosecutor



Ali Ziai grew up in Moorpark, CA and graduated from Moorpark High School. He went on to attend U.C.L.A. and graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Psychobiology in 2001. Following his time at U.C.L.A., he attended Tulane University School of Law on a partial academic scholarship and graduated in the top half of his class in 2004. During his time at Tulane, Ali volunteered at AIDS Law of Louisiana,

where he assisted HIV Positive and AIDS patients with the drafting of wills and other family law matters. After passing the July 2004 Louisiana Bar Exam, Ali worked at a small civil firm for a year, and then decided to pursue his love of criminal law by joining the Orleans Parish District Attorney's Office. He was with the Orleans D.A. for only three weeks when Hurricane Katrina devastated New Orleans in 2005. Following the hurricane, Ali moved back to Southern California where he began clerking with the Neighborhood Prosecutor Program of the Los Angeles City Attorney's Office, where Ali had clerked following his first year of law school. After passing the July 2006 California Bar Examination, Ali was hired as a Deputy City Attorney by the Los Angeles City Attorney's Office, and gained six months of criminal trial experience before going to his permanent post of Neighborhood Prosecutor for Devonshire Division. As a Neighborhood Prosecutor, Ali works with other city agencies to help resolve quality-of-life issues for residents of Devonshire Division, which includes Canoga Park, Chatsworth, Granada Hills, Northridge, Porter Ranch, West Hills, and Winnetka.

### Abandoned Shopping Carts

What started out as a simple note about a quirk in an abandoned shopping cart retrieval service has turned out to be the need for further investigation in how the city functions.

An OGH resident called a city number to have 3 carts picked up from the street outside her home. When the company came, they only took 2 of them saying that they aren't contracted with the store owner of the 3rd cart.

Wasn't some motion put before City Council to mitigate abandoned shopping carts?

ping carts?

Checking the City Council Website shows that this issue, since 2005, involves 3 valley council districts, 2 motions, the Department of Public Works, the Office of City Administrator, the City Council Public Works, Personnel, and Energy and Environmental committees. Though the documents describe the approval of 2 - 6 month pilot programs and promised reports in 2 council districts, almost 1 year apart (2006 and 2007), nothing is documented as completed. The most recently dated document, January, 2008, from the Shadow Hills Property Association to the City Council Public Works committee asks the very question of what is going on with this issue.

Now in July, it will be close to a year when, apparently, the last action was taken and over 3 years since it began.

**Neighborhood Watch**

According to the detective working ID thefts in the Valley:

- \* There are about 320 reports of ID theft a month here in the SF Valley.
- \* 90% of the crimes are due to mail theft
- \* There are 10 investigators working in the Valley
- \* Thieves watch for behavior patterns like taking note when people get their pools cleaned. Often a homeowner will leave a check for payment outside for the pool cleaner. The thief will steal that check by noting when the homeowner leaves and before the cleaner arrives.
- \* Do not return those electronic keys for hotel rooms. Some have personal information on them and can be electronically pilfered
- \* Stolen Social Security Numbers are difficult to prosecute

The area is down on vehicle related crimes but there have been 4 separate incidents of rather unusual residential burglaries involving residents coming face to face with the suspects. In all cases the suspects immediately looked for a way out and fled.

Remember to take a moment to look at your property before entering and be aware of things that may look out of place, such as forced open windows and doors, items not where you left them and suspicious vehicles parked nearby. If you suspect someone may be in your home, don't enter and call 911.

Most residential burglaries are taking place during the day with the thieves entering through unlocked doors and windows. Check your doors and windows when you leave, don't make it easy for someone to violate your home and steal your valuables

**Graffiti Taggers Arrested**

In the past month, 4 juveniles have been arrested by LAPD patrol for graffiti/vandalism. Of these 4, 2 taggers were recently arrested on Sunday, June 8 @ 3:00 AM. They tagged the dance studio at Lindley and Chatsworth. All 4 juveniles were local neighborhood kids. Luckily, we have a group of dedicated neighbors, along with VST, LAPD, have been doing a terrific job of keeping a lid on graffiti!! Not too long ago, Chatsworth St. businesses and billboards were under attack. Still, there is more that neighbors can do by being observant and looking out for juveniles or young adults who are:

- Congregating in groups of 2 or more and acting suspiciously or trying to hide from view
- Riding bikes/motorized scooters back & forth (during late night or very early morning hours) through residential streets & alleys, communicating on cell phones, & wearing back packs
- Hanging out alone or in groups in somewhat concealed areas and alleyways (specifically adjacent to Chatsworth St. and other local businesses)
- Actually vandalizing public (including streets/sidewalks) and private property

The above incidents are more common in Old Granada Hills than in other neighboring communities. Also, parents at home can be more observant by looking out for some signs that could indicate that their child is getting into trouble. Of course, many kids ride bikes and wear backpacks and that is perfectly fine. But the combination of other strange behaviors, not the best of friends, late night hours, and possessing "tools of the trade" should make a parent somewhat suspicious. Graffiti is an act of vandalism and should not be taken lightly or ignored. It is not an artistic expression, but a malicious destruction of property that can lead to violence and other crime.

From Councilman Smith's Weekly Briefing

A Patriotic Service from the Northridge Kiwanis...

Have you ever noticed the hundreds of American flags flying from street light posts along the streets in our neighborhoods? They are the work of the Kiwanis Club of Northridge, an all-volunteer organization dedicated to charitable and community projects that benefit the San Fernando Valley.

Every year, the Kiwanis Club of Northridge does this great patriotic service, donating 450 American flag Valley streets between Memorial Day and Ju pendency Day approaches, we thank the Nor for this service!

Reducing the Blight of Abandoned, Forec

We introduced a motion Wednesday, June 1 develop a substantive framework requiring owners and banks to maintain foreclosed properties to avoid deterioration of neighborhoods.

The current home foreclosure crisis has made the sight of abandoned homes, with overgrown weeds, broken windows, dead lawns and half-empty pools a common sight.

More than an eyesore, this phenomenon has the potential to destabilize our neighborhoods by reducing home values, luring squatters and vandals, and degrading the beauty of well-tended neighborhoods.

Enabling Outdoor Dining Without Secondhand Smoke...

We introduced a motion on Wednesday, June 11, that would prohibit smoking in outdoor patios where food is served in the City of Los Angeles. (Bars would be excluded.)

One of the greatest assets we have here in L.A. is our beautiful, warm weather. It is unfair and unhealthy for non-smokers, including children, to have to breathe in cancer-causing secondhand smoke if they want to enjoy outdoor dining.

Since California enacted a statewide ban on workplace smoking to protect customers and workers from secondhand smoke, smokers have come to dominate restaurant patios even though they form only a small segment of the population.

Los Angeles has already prohibited smoking in City parks and beaches (except on golf courses, for filming purposes, and within certain designated areas in larger parks). Many other cities have also banned smoking in certain public areas, including Calabasas, Malibu, Glendale, and Burbank

After exhausting all possibilities trying to convince L.A. City decision-makers to scale back a proposed over-expansion of the Granada Village Shopping Center, a writ of mandate has been filed on May 16th with the Superior Court against the City of Los Angeles, and the Florida-based property-owners Regency Centers, to stop that proposed overly-ambitious project.

Oponents to the project are concerned about the detrimental effects that such a regional discount retail "Big Box" store can bring. As proposed, the project goes against many city ordinances including the Granada Hills/Knollwood Specific Plan, which states that building size is to be "small in scale". Being over 95,000 square feet, over twice the size what it is replacing, is clearly not compatible.

Initially, the L.A. City Planning Department denied the project on numerous grounds. The four Neighborhood Councils in the area are on record with the City opposing the proposed expansion.

Mark Sellers of the law firm of Jackson, Demarco, Tidus & Peckinpaugh will be representing those in opposition.

**Trash Scavengers**

Concerned OGH residents have noticed scavengers rummaging through trash cans as they sit in the street before regularly scheduled trash pick-up. This is an illegal activity despite its seemingly harmless appearance. Trash pilferers:



- Can be searching for pieces of identity to steal
- Foster an underground economy by selling recyclables to a "middleman"
- Siphon off the city's recycling profit
- Trespass onto private property
- They are easily identifiable and generally carry large plastic bags filled with

refuse. Or they fill their own large trashcan, rolling up to curbside cans that residents have prepared for City refuse collectors. Similar to graffiti, blight, illegal dumping – a proliferation of trash scavengers sends a message to other criminals that the community is not watching. And when neighborhoods become apathetic and "turn a blind eye", other more serious crimes are certain to follow.

For your own safety do not approach or confront these individuals. Instead, report pertinent details such as time, day, location, (if driving- description of vehicle and license plate #) to the LADP- Non-Emergency Dispatch at 877-275-5273

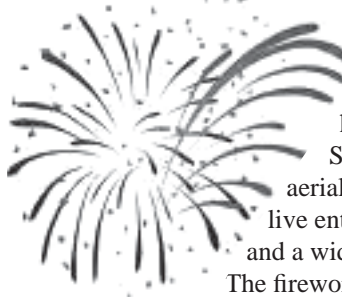
**50¢ To The Beach**
